



School Sports Partnership

The Blessed Robert Sutton School Sports Partnership works with 18 local Primary Schools, to help improve the provision of Physical Education and bridge the gap between Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 3 PE. The partnership goes into these schools and delivers PE specific teacher training, curriculum support, organises sporting competitions and provides leadership and volunteering opportunities for students at Blessed Robert Sutton.

Leadership opportunities

With employment becoming ever so competitive, it is crucial that students develop a range of skills which is vital for career development. Therefore, students are provided with various opportunities to develop their leadership skills through Physical Education and Sport. Students can enrol in the Leadership Academy, where they learn the fundamental skills of how to lead a group and are encouraged to work voluntarily within their local community. They will also be encouraged to lead sessions within local primary schools, and assist in the delivery of inter-school competitions through the School Sports Partnership.

In addition, all students will develop their leadership skills during PE lessons, where they will have the opportunity to participate in various leadership courses and through the Sport Education model being used in various activity areas. This teaching approach encourages the students to take ownership of their own learning and take on different roles within the class.
